Well, we will now have two issues of the Ranch Sorter under our belts. The first was a bit of a challenge. Trying to get all the show results, articles, ads, point standings, calendar of events, etc. gathered-up, okayed by all the editors, sent to the publisher, and then on to the printer taxed our organizational skills to say the least. However, when it was all said and done, the final result was positive.



We were able to see where changes needed to be made, and we have strived to make changes where needed. Thank you to all who gave us input, made suggestions, and have continued to be supportive through this process!

We continue to welcome write-ups and photos from our RSNC producers; we encourage all to let us know how your shows are going. Something to remember, cameras need to be on the highest resolution setting if you are planning on sending pictures for print in the publication. High resolution is a must in order to avoid fuzzy images in the magazine.

With over 9000 copies of The Ranch Sorter sent out, we are getting a tremendous response from both contestants and producers. There is a lot of contestant interest about the 2008 RSNC points race. The decision to make it a state by state competition leading up to the finals has opened-up the race and, as each week passes, many new names are appearing in the point standings.

If you are not familiar with the RSNC points race, it's easy to understand and even easier to get involved! All year long, contestants compete for the top twenty positions (point accumulations) in six different categories within their state. Contestants can earn points in ANY state; all their points will be added to their total in their home state. This gives everyone a fair shot to qualify for year-end awards whether they have a lot of shows in their area or just a few. The top twenty point earners in each division, in each state, qualify for the year-end high point awards at the RSNC Finals. Qualifiers compete for saddles, buckles, jackets, and other year-end awards at the RSNC National Finals held in October. Be sure to check the website for the latest point standings in your state!

I want to be sure that everyone knows that ALL RSNC Members (not just those qualified for High Point awards) are ENCOURAGED and WELCOME to attend and compete at the National Finals. Any member that competed at three or more sanctioned events throughout the year, is eligible for an ADDITIONAL 10% BONUS in paybacks. Furthermore, these divisions are expected to have huge payouts and many prizes for everyone!

States like Missouri (see article page 17) have really gotten excited about RSNC sanctioned events and the points race. Several summer/fall series have been scheduled in that state. We welcome the "Show Me State" aboard and look forward to seeing all you Missourians at the finals in October!

Along with more events and more contestants come more sponsors and supporters of the sport. I want to welcome one of our newest sponsors, International Agricultural Manufacturing, LLC. If you need a tractor or arena implement, check-out the ad in this publication and give IAM a call. They have what you need!

After taking the winter off, many of you are now getting your horses back in shape. Spring is in full swing, and we are excited to see you back in the arena. If you want to do some Ranch Sorting but don't have any RSNC events in your area, I urge you to pick up the phone and give me a call. When I am able to tell potential producers that there are people in the area looking for an event, they are much more willing to host a clinic, practice, or competition.

One last note, changing to a 9-point rating system has required some adjustment from both producers and contestants, but the overwhelming consensus is that it has openedup the competition for new and novice participants. This is bringing more people to Ranch Sorting which helps everyone in every aspect of the sport. RSNC is experiencing tremendous growth, and it is because we made room at the bottom for new people. Thank you to everyone for allowing this to happen. It will make this sport become huge!

## RSNC MEMBERS FORUM

### **QUESTION:**

What is the advantage to having handicapped classes as opposed to incentive classes?

#### **ANSWER FROM DAVE:**

Incentive divisions work well when there are substantial cash purses created by large classes with high entry fees. This allows for the purse to be split more ways while still awarding large sums of cash to the winners. However, RSNC is committed to keeping entry fees as low as possible in addition to creating a jackpot system for the weekend contestant. Therefore, the handicap system was introduced to replace the incentive so that all contestants will have a fair opportunity to ride against higher rated contestants without splitting up the pot. This prevents the awarded sums from becoming so small that no one wins an exciting amount of money. Learning the new handicapped system requires some effort from timers and secretaries, but it is making a positive difference for contestants. We appreciate everyone's willingness to adjust!

Saddles will be awarded to the high point contestant in each category. Prizes will be awarded thru 10th place.

For the number of points awarded in a division RSNC has adopted the AQHA point system.

Any division that has 100 or more teams will be double points.

Any contestant can earn points in any sanctioned class in which they are eligible to ride. The Masters will be a class of its own throughout the year and those points will be kept separately. The points will be awarded throughout the year to give contestants who compete in RSNC events an advantage going to the National Finals. The top 20 contestants in each category, from each state, will enter the finals with 20 to 1 points respectively.

At the National Finals, all points earned in any division will be added to the points you entered the Finals with to determine the top ten prize winners in each category, including the six Vinton Saddles.

The Top 20 from each division, in each state, will be eligible for year end awards.

Points earned will be added to a contestant's point total in his/her home state, regardless of the state in which the points were won.

If during the course of the year a contestant advances into a higher division, all the contestant's point will be transferred into the new division UNLESS this would improve the contestant's placement in the points race. For example, if a beginner is in third place with 10 points when he/she graduates into the Rookie division where the third place contestant has only eight (8) points, then the graduating beginner would only carry eight (8) points in to the Rookie division and be tied for third place.

## **PIECES OF THE PAST**

e are all painfully aware of the nasty reality known as INFLATION; especially those of us who spend a lot of time on the road – and at the fuel pump.

As I was pondering the topic of my next Pieces of the Past, it was suggested that I research the cost of gas in 1950. I almost hated to go there. I mean, why rub salt in a wound? However, since it was my boss that made the suggestion ... well, I thought it was A GREAT IDEA!

I started my research and became increasingly intrigued by the rising cost of living in general. So, I decided to make a few comparisons. I kicked around some possibilities and finally settled on milk, bread, gasoline, and minimum wage. I realize that minimum wage is not a "cost", but it has an obvious role in this matter.


### ... it is the MILK prices that stand out.

I must testify that my attitude about how EXPENSIVE everything seems to be has improved somewhat. As you can see from the graph, the price of gasoline has risen dramatically, but so has the minimum wage. Granted, a large percentage of wages are going into the gas tank; however, if you look at disproportionate costs, it is the MILK prices that stand out.

In 1958, a person working for minimum wage had to work for over an hour to pay for that gallon of milk he or she was supposed to pick-up on the way home. In comparison to the minimum wage, milk has actually become cheaper - yes, I realize that you are paying over \$3 a gallon, but that is still less than 60% percent of an hourly income as opposed to over 100% in 1958!



# FEATURED PRODUCER

## **SPRING CREEK RANCH** Bryan Kammerdiener and Tommy Robertson

he May/June Featured Producer is the team of Bryan Kammerdiener and Tommy Roberson of the Spring Creek Ranch in Gainesville, Texas. In May, Spring Creek Ranch will be celebrating the fifth anniversary of producing events at its arena. Bryan Kammerdiener was born on the Spring Creek Ranch and has spent his life on the seven hundred acre spread. He and his wife, Susie, raised three children on the ranch and are now grooming their grandchildren to carry on the family tradition. They run approximately three-hundred yearling heifers year-round on the Texas grasslands.

Tommy Roberson and his wife, Laura, have been on the Spring Creek Ranch for the past two years. They have two sons; twelve-year-old Travis is still helping on the ranch and riding with Mom and Dad. Both families are avid fans of ranch sorting. "We love the sport!" claims Roberson. Since becoming sanctioned producers, Roberson and

Kammerdiener have been extremely successful with RSNC sortings. Their first show hosted 385 teams; turn-out has

been steady ever since. When asked what he contributes to the interest, Roberson says that the key is catering to the novice and amateur riders. Kammerdiener agrees. Kammerdiener, who describes ranch sorting as "the best thing going down the road," attributes RSNC's popularity to the fact that the association has made success attainable for the less experienced rider. He says, "People with entry-level skills can be successful."

When asked what could help the sport of ranch sorting grow, the two men had definite opinions. Roberson says that the horsemanship skills of the participants, regardless of their experience, have a huge impact on the way the sport is perceived. He would like to see less "whipping and spurring" and more skilled riding. According to Roberson, even a beginner can exhibit good horsemanship in the pen. Furthermore, he says he has witnessed experienced riders that are too rough on both horses and cattle. Roberson believes that in order for the sport to have the respect and support of the professional horse industry, the riders must be skilled, if not experienced, and the cattle must be treated humanely. He encourages riders to develop and practice good horsemanship. Kammerdiener reiterates the "cater to the beginners and rookies" theory. He says getting new people into the sport is key. He says a huge incentive for these riders is added money in the lower-level classes. Traditionally, the big pay-outs go to the open and upper-level classes; Kammerdiener says, "It needs to be reversed." Both men agree, "…sorting is going to grow…it's going to be the future."

## THE RIGHT SORT OF HORSE

In case it hasn't been said enough, I'll say it again ... GET A GOOD HORSE! A successful, healthy equine experience is like a successful, healthy marriage; it's a partnership. It's not always a 50/50 deal, but strengths and weaknesses are balanced.

Whether you are planning on competing regularly or just riding occasionally, you need the right sort of horse – the pun is intended. However, there really isn't such a thing as a Ranch Sorting horse... yet.

In other disciplines such as western pleasure, cutting, and hunter hack, horses have been bred for generations to meet a standard for that event. Ranch Sorting hasn't been around (as an organized event) long enough for very many breeders to focus their programs on creating the perfect sorting horse. Some people will tell you that you need a cutter, others will tell you that you need a "horse with cow", but not a cutter. Some will say that any ol' horse will work. In reality, they are all right.

Horses with "cow" as in "cowhorse" in their pedigree will have a higher likelihood of being interested in the cattle and the work that goes along with it. A horse that

has had cutting training should react to the cattle in a manner reflective of that training; this horse may make a better "gate" horse than one who hasn't had the training. A horse that is bred and built like a halter horse will probably not maneuver as quickly as a cowhorse; likewise, a cowhorse will probably not be as fast as a racehorse. I could go on, but I think you get the point. So, let's get back to the partnership theory. Everyone should have a horse they like, get along with, and feel safe on. Yes, there is a difference between like and get along with - as anyone who has ever had an encounter with the opposite sex can testify. Furthermore, you and your horse should balance each others' strengths and weaknesses. If you are a beginner rider with very few horsemanship skills and even less confidence, you SHOULD NOT be on a young, green broke horse that has never left the ranch. It doesn't matter what kind of breeding the horse has ... you are headed for a wreck. One of the great things about RSNC – and

you'll hear it again and again – is that a beginner rider can be competitive, even

on a slower, safer horse. As a matter of fact, those beginner riders that are paired with an appropriate horse are usually more competitive because they are more consistent and have fewer blow-outs. In an RSNC Beginner Ranch Hand class, there is a designated gate man who can be an experienced rider. The beginner rider is the "sorter" and actually works in the herd. Sorting cattle from the herd can be done on any horse that will go, stop, and turn on command. It doesn't have to be done at break-neck speed.

Horses that are not well-broke or otherwise suited for competitive riding may spook at the cattle or other distractions, throw their head in the air (thus, not being able to focus on the task at hand), run past cattle instead of trailing them, or sull-up and not go at all. Fighting an untrained horse will make a rider discouraged and take the fun out of the sorting experience.

Having a "professionally trained" horse is not a fix-it-all, either. If a rider's skills do not match that of the horse, the horse might as well not be trained at all. It is like a 5 year old sitting behind the wheel of a Porche.

Have you ever heard the phrase, "She'll spin-out from under you!"? Believe me, it can happen. And though it may not physically hurt; I promise that your pride and your confidence will be wounded. Just keep in mind, those professional trainers make it look easy because THEY ARE PROFESSIONALS.

If you have spent the money to buy a trained horse or have a horse trained, then the smart thing to do is spend the money TO HAVE YOURSELF TRAINED! Nothing "undoes" training faster than an untrained rider. Horsemanship lessons are a worthy investment. Everyone and anyone can benefit from a professional's advice and teachings.

When you are considering purchasing a horse, please ride the horse more than once – on different days if possible. Ride the horse outside of the arena – if you feel safe doing so; if not, get off and hand the reins back. And, once again, you may get along with the horse, but if you don't feel a strong like for him or vice versa... he may not be "the one". Be patient so that you are sure you've got *THE RIGHT SORT OF HORSE*.
