MEDIA COMES KNOCKING ON THE DOOR

In the past several months, good publicity has come knocking on RSNC's door, and knocking loudly, which is great news for the sport - and the organization." The sport of Ranch Sorting is not growing. It's exploding!" says RSNC President Dave Wolfe. Since 2007, the organized sport has experienced phenomenal growth, and continues today with nearly 3,900 teams at this year's finals. That's up 290 % from the first finals just three years ago.

Beginning several years ago, the American Quarter Horse Association introduced working cow horse and Versatility Ranch Horse events, leading the way for ranch sorting. In 2007, AQHA recognized Ranch Sorting as a point-earning event and every year since it has been AQHA's largest World Show event. Participation and growth spread rapidly.

Along with all the growth experienced and enjoyed by the organization, professionals in a wide variety of equine competition disciplines are taking notice too, and this year, they lined up for a chance to be part of the RSNC phenomenon, including high visibility television personalities

Wide World of Horses, a TV show on cable television station RFD-TV, ran an entire hour long episode of their show on the 2010 RSNC finals held in Ardmore, Oklahoma. The producer and one of show's on-air hosts, Lee Schneider, realized that the sport was growing roots and

taking hold in rural America. He decided to invest his production team's

time and efforts

capturing the exciting events as they unfolded at the finals, and spent some time in an interview with Dave Wolfe. "You can go to any rural community and advertise this sport and people will show up and compete. It's a lot of fun!" Dave said.

Equally exciting, Aaron Ralston, producer and host of RFD-TV television show, 'The Ride' ran an hour-long episode as well. Aaron's show captures a glimpse of the modern ranch cowboy, highlighting tips, people, events, and how the ranch work translates into competitive horse sports. In May of 2010, Aaron and his production team saw the value of the growing sport so clearly that they not only produced the television episode, but even created a feature-packed DVD to further spread the word about this fun, family sport. Aaron said of the ranch sorting sport, "This is something that's very close and dear to my heart. Having grown up on a reach. I

my heart. Having grown up on a ranch, I appreciate the level of horsemanship and stockmanship that goes into it."

As if television wasn't enough,

As if television wasn't enough, this October's edition of Western Horseman featured RSNC in a three page article. The magazine's editors clearly recognize RSNC as the leader of a great sport for the whole family and also highlighted its phenomenal growth over the years. The magazine's printed circulation of nearly 165,000 means that many professional horsemen, from ranchers, ropers and barrel racers


to breeders, trail riders and

RSNC SOFTWARE HAS MAXIMUM TRANSPARENCY FOR CONTESTANTS

The new RSNC software is proving to be an exceptional tool for both producers and contestants. Not only can our producers run their events more efficiently and accurately, but our contestants can now be more informed.

It is extremely important that contestants are assured they are charged correctly for the number of rides they rode and are paid correctly for their winnings. The RSNC software has made that process easy for our producers. Producers using the RSNC software now have an easy solution to being 100% transparent to their valued contestants.


We thought it would be important to explain exactly what the following 3 reports are so you understand that each report serves a purpose.

- **1. Final Payout List:** This list is posted for contestants to see after a class has been completed. This list is available for viewing during the show, it will not be sent home with contestants.
- **2. Individual Rider Report:** This report can be printed at the request of the rider and taken home. Please remember, if it is a big show or if you ride a lot, there will be several pages of this report.
- **3. Invoice for Show:** This invoice is given to you to take home when you finished competing at the show. It is your opportunity to confirm your classes, money won, and money owed. This invoice will verify how much money you owe or if you get a check paid to you from the producer. With this vital information we want you to go home with confidence,

I just wanted to drop you a note and thank you for taking the time to develop the RSNC Ranch Sorting Software.

I have been using the RSNC Ranch Sorting software since it came out, at both small and large shows, and I will say whole heartedly, this is

the complete package. This software provides so much information with just a click on one of the main menu items. I am able to print out teams in a class by an alphabetical list or a class run sheet, projected payouts, and an end of the day financial report, again, with just a click on a main menu item. How easy!

For any producer the financial side of a program is very important. The ease of checking people out at the end of the day and entering the payments (or winnings) made by the contestant is fantastic. The ledger used in the rider invoicing provides a detailed way to keep track of payments for stalls and classes, as well as any other item that the contestant earns or pays for.

I have used other software programs and I have found this program is head and shoulders above them. This program was designed for any producer with or with out software experience and I highly recommend it.

RSNC CONTESTANTS SORT FOR AUTISM IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS

One day in 1988, a lean dark-eyed horseman was moved as he toured the Autism Treatment Center. The horseman was Bobby Norris, a former president of the American Cutting Horse. Bobby had an autistic daughter and was searching for an organization to receive the proceeds of a newly formed charity event he had organized. As the result of that tour, 1988 was the first year Bobby hosted the Bobby Norris Roundup for Autism. This renowned event is designed to raise funds for the Autism Treatment Centers; of Texas (ATC), a private, nonprofit, 501(c)(3) corporation that serves both children and adults with autism, and those who are multi-

handicapped. He has continued to host the event each subsequent year.

Bobby Norris Roundup for Autism is one of Texas' largest fundraisers for autism. This weekend event kicks-off with a full day of Ranch Sorting in an indoor arena and a VIP party in the heart of Fort Worth's Historical Stockyards on Thursday. The rest of the weekend includes a rodeo at Cowtown Coliseum, a black tie ball and two golf tournaments in the fall.

The Ranch Sorting event was introduced into this weekend event in 2009 and over 130 teams participated and raised over \$16,000 for the ATC. For 2010 the number of teams increased

to over 160 in spite of some very rainy weather. This Ranch Sorting is a RSNC Special Sanctioned event. The 2011 Ranch sorting will be held Thursday, September 8, 2011 and plans are currently underway for an even bigger event. An added bonus for next year's event will pair the winning Ranch Sorting teams with a celebrity team in the Team Penning event at the Friday night rodeo and there are also plans to include a Mutton Bustin' championship. Horse training clinics and working cow dog demonstrations will be conducted during the day on Friday.





Trophy buckle also. Roy Thomas was our season high point. Our shows wouldn't be the same without Roy around to liven things up!

We kicked off the 2010- 2011 show season on Oct. 2nd. Not much seemed to change from May. It was blasted humid and hot. Our calves were fresh and didn't take the stress well. I spent most of my day worrying about the cattle getting too hot! We had to take a lot of breaks to let the cattle cool.

Our numbers were maybe down a little bit to start off the season. Hopefully it was the heat and not the economy. I hate it when my friends can't come over to play! We ran 2 separate pens in 2 separate arenas at this show. We are trying to shorten up our show length. I want the lower # classes to be able to compete earlier in the day too. Since I use 4 sets of calves for the 3or4 lower classes and 4 sets of calves for the 3or4 upper classes; it was fairly easy to have both arenas go at the same time. It was a bit confusing for some of the competitors that have never done the back and forth thing; but I think they'll all catch on. We tried a new class this year. A #5 sorting with a 3 cap. It was very successful with 38 teams. To get the 3's to want to help the #2's, I added \$ and 1st place buckles. It was a really nice class. Melissa Forte and Marcia Coker took home the buckles and a big chunk of cash; as I ended up adding \$400 to the class since it turned out to have a good # of entries. Congrats to them!

Cheryl Kirton continued on with her winning streak from last year. She won the All Levels with Courtney Hutto and the #6 class with Danna McFarland. I think it's safe to say she's still on a roll!

Alice Murphy riding "Bubba"; our most favorite paint horse ever, won the beginner class. She had her buddy Tish Prine sittin' in the gate for her. Alice and Bubba are making an awesome match.

As always, we're making changes trying to have something for everyone at our shows. Sometimes it works and sometimes it doesn't?!

We're hoping for another great year in the sorting pen. This is our 9th year of putting on Ranch Sortings!! WOW where did all those years go?

Let's Smell the Roses!

Hi Dave,

We have lived in Burkesville, Kentucky for six years. We moved here from South East Florida where my husband was a salt water fly-fishing guide and I am the owner of a silk flower and decorating business. We also boarded horses. It has been a dream of mine to be in the beef cattle business; a goal that I have worked on the past fifteen years.

Matt and a friend visited Burkesville to fish the Cumberland River. He returned from his trip enthusiastic about the country he saw. He called it, "God's Country" because of the abundant wildlife and the natural beauty of this area. We were in hopes of buying a few acres on the river and ended up with an old farm that needed some attention. We bought a mobile home and after staying here one summer, we decided to move.

When we lived in Florida, I would ride over at Debbie McFarland's place. We team penned together and then she introduced me to ranch sorting. I fell in love with the game right from the start! I liked the fact that it was a timed team event. I liked the idea of the interdependence between the riders, the horses and the cattle. I believe that it is a great family sport. Everyone from young to old can enjoy this game. I felt like it was a very affordable cattle event with a place for all levels of riders and horses. It is a sport with so much room for growth. I especially like the chance it gives people to be around beef cattle.

I searched high and low to find a place to sort and there was not much of an opportunity anywhere near here, so, we decided to build our own pens, but first we needed cattle and somewhere to put them. Debbie had talked about preconditioning cattle and the idea of it really intrigued me because I really wanted to have cattle I could work my horses on. We did

not have any farming experience, so we spent a couple of years learning everything from fencing, pen design, feeder cattle health and nutrition, running tractors and their implements, forages... You name it. It has been a total lifestyle change and a welcome one. We have never worked so hard and never been so happy.

We built 60' sorting pens with a 12' gate. We installed crushed rock and topped it with a few inches of sand, so the footing would be adequate in wet weather, being that our facility is not under roof. The pens are well lit and this is really great when the weather is hot, we can work the cattle in the evening. I believe this will also come in handy if the shows run late.

The cattle and their well being is very important to us. We number more cattle than really necessary, so they stay pretty fresh. We buy heifers, so that is what we ride on.

I have had a handful of practice sortings with a small number of participants and spectators. This has given me the opportunity to offer adequate parking, room for spectators, concessions and cattle flow. I want my first sanctioned show to make a good lasting impression. I would appreciate any suggestions.

I do not have stalls, but I have several pens that are not covered along electric fence turnouts. I also have 10' Priefert panels for temporary stalls. There is a really neat bed and breakfast approximately 4 miles away with 8 stalls in a nice barn and beautiful accommodations in a log house setting. Their website is www. hiddencaveranch.com. The Riverfront Motel is ¼ mile from our facility and is a nice clean motel on the river with a pool. There is a grocery store, Pizza Hut, and Dollar General right next to it.

We have some electric and water hook ups and welcome camping. We have a great 5 mile trail ride that wraps around our farm through the hills.

We are 2 hours from Louisville, Kentucky and Nashville, Tennessee. We are 2 ½ hours from Lexington, Kentucky and Knoxville, Tennessee. We are 1 ½ hours from Bowling Green, Kentucky. The roads are pretty good from all these places. Debbie McFarland has been a great resource of information for me. She introduced me to RSNC and she has really helped me learn about doctoring calves.

We have hosted a couple of field days for the University of Kentucky field days. I was the President of the Clinton/Cumberland County Cattlemen's association last year. I am also serving on the county board of directors for the Kentucky Farm Bureau. We have attended the Kentucky Cattlemen's Association Convention the last two years. My son and I attended the NCBA convention in San Antonio last year. We attend many other beef conferences throughout the year. I really love to learn and better at what I am doing. I really believe in the beef cattle industry and the promotion of agriculture. I feel that it is really important to expose people to farming and animal agriculture. I believe it is an industry that needs to be protected and promoted.

In November, we are hosting a morning and afternoon session for the local high school agricultural class. We will run some calves through the chute, demonstrate vaccinations and castration. We also plan on doing a ranch sorting demonstration. Although there are many cattle in this area, very few people handle their cattle with horses and I think this will be a great opportunity to demonstrate what ranch sorting is.

I would love for you to attend our first RSNC event.



STATE FINALS ARE COMING YOUR WAY!

That's right. Many states that have hosted RSNC events are making plans to host a state finals just for you. Be sure to check the RSNC web site to see if your state is on the list. I would like to take just a minute to explain some of the details.

First, RSNC is supporting the state finals with RSNC trophy jackets to high point winners of the year long State points race. The producers who hosted events with the most teams for the previous year up to the RSNC finals had 1st opportunity to host the finals.

Second, points have been earned by contestants since January at all sanctioned events they attended. Those points determine your position in the top 20 of each rating category. The categories are Beginner, Rookie, Novice, Amateur, Open and Masters. If you moved from one category to another during the year the appropriate points moved with you and you will compete at the finals within your current rating category. Once at the finals you will enter with a point advantage based on your top 20 standings with 20 points for 1st down to 1 point for 20th. Those points will be added to points won in the finals classes to determine the State Champions in each rating category.

Third, in states that had at least 5 sanctioned events jackets will be awarded to the State Champion in each rating category. Those states that had 10 or more sanctioned events will receive jackets for the top 5 point earning contestants in each rating category. That's 30 jackets awarded!

Fourth, there will be sample jackets to try on for appropriate sizes with order forms for the winners to fill out. A total of 500 jackets have been

ordered and will arrive at the RSNC office in November. As soon as we receive your size your State Championships jackets will be mailed!

Last, we at RSNC want everyone to know that anyone can attend the State finals and compete. We do appreciate all contestants and producers support to help this great sport grow. The State Finals is a great way to bring all contestants together for what will surely be the largest events of the year.


THAR'S RANCH SORTING SEPTEMBER 11


