2011/2012 RATING ADJUSTMENT

I would like to visit with you about RSNC Ratings. We believe you agree our fair rating system that has made room at the bottom for new beginners and has been supported by the win/loss ratio method of rating evaluations, has contributed greatly to the growth of this sport. It is performance based, rather than based on opinion, so that every contestant is treated with consistency and fairness. However with the tremendous growth of the association, especially with such a high percentage of brand new contestants entering the sport at the beginner and rookie level, it has been difficult to manage the bottleneck at the #3 rating.

Each year we have moved the highest percentage of contestants from the #3 rating to #4 but we readily admit it still has not been enough. From listening to you our members, we realize there is a tremendous variety in ability at that level, and we apologize for allowing that to become the melting pot of skill levels. Therefore, for the health of the sport, we intend to make a major adjustment at the start of the new season in July. From there forward we will more carefully monitor potential bottlenecks.

From reviewing win/loss ratios, if we move only a large percentage of #3's then we will immediately create the same bottleneck at the #4 level. Therefore, ratings must be moved all the way up through the rating system at a graduating level. Starting in the 2011/2012 season the win/loss ratio will as always determine who moves up or down, but there will be a significant adjustment to the percent of contestants moved up, and it will be based on this chart as the general guidelines:

Rating Level	% Moving Up
3	30%
4	25%
5	20%
6	15%
7	10%
8	5%

This takes into account the percent of contestants that have competed enough throughout the year to warrant rating evaluations. With such a large membership base, this will generate a considerable rating adjustment. This adjustment is at the request of producers and members all across the U.S.

Realizing that up to 50% of your entry fee goes to cattle charges and production, if you have a .50 win/loss ratio or higher then you have beat the odds, and are on the positive side of the jackpot. If we were evaluating jackpot money alone, then the current 50% would represent 100% or 1.0 in the win/loss ratio. All contestants that have a .50 win/loss ratio or higher are winning 100% of the money they have invested in the jackpot, and are beating the majority of the others within their rating.

The data shows that the higher the rating, the higher the win/loss ratio of contestants, which means higher rated contestants are winning a higher percent of their entry fees back. This stands to reason since the more a contestant practices, competes, and improves, the greater his or her odds are of being consistently successful and winning more money.

Therefore, the system is healthy and working, making room within the system for the thousands that are entering it. Just another reason to continue and improve our individual skills and abilities. We all want this sport to continue to explode and there is no room for rating bottlenecks.

No one said growing a sport is or should be easy but you have made it happen. Your sharing and promoting the fun with your friends and family is not only making it fun but is also putting more money in your pocket. You have grown this sport by bringing in so many new contestants that will progress with their ability and move fairly up through the RSNC rating system. You are making it happen!!

To win the Masters saddles or prizes you must be in the top 20 masters from your state plus earn points in the Masters class.

The Masters will be a class of its own throughout the year and those points will be kept separately. The points will be awarded throughout the year to give contestants who compete in RSNC events an advantage going to the National Finals. The top 20 contestants in each category, from each state, will enter the finals with 40 to 2 points respectively. In the Masters division you will enter the finals with 20-1 points respectively.

The Top 20 from each division, in each state will be eligible for year-end awards.

A contestant throughout the year can earn points in any state, but will represent the state in which they live.

In the event that the contestant's rating is changed, his/her points will be carried with him/her to the next division unless moving those points improves the contestant's

standing in the points race. In this case only the points that will put the contestant in the same standing as the division prior will be carried over. Example: A Novice has 50 points, is in Fourth place and is moved to the Amateur division. The Fourth place Amateur has 30 points. In this case the Novice being moved can only transfer 30 of his/her 50 points to the Amateur division, tying with the Fourth place Amateur. However, every contestant that graduates from Novice to Amateur or Amateur to Open is automatically qualified for the Finals with a minimum of 10 points.

- A contestant that places in the top 10 in 2 rating categories will accept the highest award or if equal, then the award from the highest rating. If they are tied with a rating category & the Masters class, they will accept the award where they earned the most points. These rules will also represent qualification for the State Extravaganza.

2010 - 2011
 OFFICIAL CONTEST RULES

The purpose of the RSNC sort for the Reinsman saddles contest is to serve as an incentive for participation in sanctioned events. In the 10'-11' season, point totals will be kept from July 4th, 2010 to June 18, 2011 using the RSNC software and July 4th, 2010 to June 4th, 2011 if not using the software. The top 20 point earners from each state, as well as all frozen contestants, in six separate categories will enter the National Finals with 40 points to 2 point respectively. In the Masters Division you will enter the finals with 20-1 points respectively. There is a minimum of 5 shows requirement to be eligible for prizes.

1. Contestants must be a current member to earn points for the saddle race.
2. The Masters' Division will be a class of its own and the points will be kept separately.
3. A contestant will represent his/her home state. Points earned at shows outside a contestant's home state will be added to his/her total in the state in which he/she resides.
4. In addition to the Reinsman saddle, the top 20 point earners from each state will be eligible for other yearend prizes. However, a contestant must have attended 5 shows and may only claim one year-end award in the Sort for the Saddle contest.
5. In the event that a contestant's rating is changed, his/her points will be carried with him/her to the next division unless moving those points improves the contestant's standing in the points race. In this case, only the points that will put the contestant in the same standing as in the prior division will be carried over. Example: A NOVICE has 50 points and is in 4th place in the standings when she becomes an AMATEUR. The current 4th place AMATEUR has 30 points. In this case, the rider that is graduating from NOVICE to AMATEUR can only transfer 30 of her 50 points to the new division. The two riders will now be in a tie for the 4th place AMATEUR position.

6. Contestants graduating from Beginner to Rookie will be automatically qualified for the National finals with a minimum of 20 points in the Graduated Beginner division. A Beginner that graduates to a Rookie and then to a Novice will be eligible to ride in the Graduated Rookie and the Novice divisions at the 2011 Finals. Contestants graduating from Rookie to Novice will be automatically qualified for the National Finals in the Graduated Rookie division with a minimum of 20 points. All other contestants that are moved from one division to another will be automatically qualified for the Finals, with a minimum of 20 points, in the division they graduated into. Graduated contestants are eligible to compete for paybacks in every division for which they are qualified, but may only claim one year-end award in the Sort for the Saddle contest.
7. In the event that there is a tie on points for the Saddle and other top 10 prizes there will be a Tie Breaker. Total # of cattle sorted in all events that points were applied to is 1st tie breaker. If this does not solve the tie breaker then we will go to the shortest amount of time it took to sort that amount of cattle.

The RSNC National Finals is an open event; this means anyone may compete at this contest and win pay-backs as well as other prizes. Contestants that competed at 5 or more RSNC events during the '10-'11 season are eligible for maximum % on any payback. Only the top 20 point earners from each state that have attended 5 shows are eligible for the saddle or other year-end awards.

Reinsman Saddles will be awarded to the highpoint contestant in each category. Other prizes will be awarded through 10th place. In the 2010-2011 season, qualifying points will be earned at shows using the RSNC software from July 4th, 2010 to June 18th, 2011 or June 4th, 2011 if not using the software. There is a minimum of 5 shows requirement to be eligible for prizes. The top 20 point earners in each category as well all frozen contestants will enter the Finals with 40 points down to 2 point respectively. In the Masters Division you will enter the finals with 20-1 points respectively. It's anyone's game – come play!

The Results tell the difference. If you haven't had a chance to glance at the results from the last 2 RSNC National Finals, we suggest you do so. There is one glaring fact that jumps out. That is the percent of repeat winners. The mandatory graduation based on three checks and dollars won is keeping it fresh and wide open for more new contestants to win, proven by the results showing zero repeat winners anywhere in the beginner and rookie classes. Additionally there was only one number 3 or below rated rider with a repeat placing from the top 20 riders in the graduated beginner, graduated rookie and #6/#4 inc. classes.

It stands to reason with the RSNC rating system there would be no repeat beginners, and very few repeat rookie's winning because they move up. That is by design and is working well, but how about all the other divisions with no more than three out of the top 20 riders in any class with a repeat placing. This shows everyone must be fairly rated because no one is dominating anywhere throughout the system. The results are astounding, showing everyone has a great chance to win.

Instead of a trickle down affect, RSNC is experiencing a tremendous trickle up affect. The base is the new beginner, and as they improve and succeed they are moving on up through the ranks of the handicap system. Practice makes perfect and experience improves your skills. The system is working and growing the association exponentially!

MAKE YOUR STATE PROUD IN THE 2011 STATE EXTRAVAGANZA ONE CLASS... 6 REINSMAN SADDLES

* You must be one of the 3 highest point riders attending from your state in your rating category to qualify.

* All highest point riders attending from a state will be your state team A. All 2nd highest point riders attending from a state will be your state team B. All 3rd highest point riders attending from a state will be your state team C.

* It is necessary to have attended five sanctioned shows to ride in the STATE EXTRAVAGANZA.

* The highest point Beginner, Rookie, Novice, Amateur, Open and Masters from each state will each ride twice with their five other state team members on their state team A.

* The 2nd highest point Beginner, Rookie, Novice, Amateur, Open and Masters from each state will each ride twice with their five other state team members on their state team B.

* The 3rd highest point Beginner, Rookie, Novice, Amateur, Open and Masters from each state will each ride twice with their five other state team members on their state team C.

* If you place in the top 3 positins in your state in 2 different categories (ex. Novice and Masters) you can ride on 2 different teams. (ex. Team A and Team C)

* If you are tied in the same position (ex. 1st place in both categories) then you will ride in that category that you earned the most points in. In the other category you will trade positions with the next person under you. Example; you

are in first place in the Novice class with 89 points and first place in the Masters class with 50 points. You will ride on the 1st team, Team A, as a Novice. You will ride on the 2nd team, Team B, as a Masters. The 2nd place person in the Masters class will ride with the 1st place team, Team A. Those 2 contestants will swap places.

* If you placed in 3rd place position in 2 categories then you will trade places with the 2nd place person in the category that you earned the least amount of points in.

* Each state team of 6 will pick 3 teams from their 6 members for their 1st ride. They will also draw a partner from their 6 for their 2nd ride. The draw will be done by RSNC in the following manner:

"MAKING THE BEST EVEN BETTER"

Last Year the largest single day clinic in the history of the sport was held at the CSU Equine Center in Fort Collins, Colorado with 151 enthusiastic participants. It could not have been better! Or could it? This year we made the best better with 162!!!

Where are they all coming from is the most asked question by everyone. It's pretty simple. It's called good old elbow grease. Ads are put in the horse publications, on the radio, fliers are posted in gas stations, local businesses, and feed stores, the phone is picked up and personal invites are made. There are thousands of horse enthusiasts who are waiting to be invited to our sport and all they are waiting for is the opportunity.

Step two, help your producer plan an introductory clinic and then help them put out the effort to let the entire community know about it. Below is just one sample of a new friend at RSNC.

AN OLD COWBOY GETS HOOKED ON RANCH SORTING AT THE CSU CLINIC! BY GEORGE G. JOHNSON JR.

"The cattle are ready. Your cow is number 3." With these words I entered a new and completely enjoyable world. That of is the world of Ranch Sorting.

On March 19th, at the invitation of Dave Wolfe and Don Goddard of Ranch Sorting National Championship, I drove to Colorado State University to participate in a sorting clinic. I had tried on several occasions to ride in a clinic but, for a number of reasons, hadn't been able to do so. However, on this day all things came together. Dave Wolfe very generously let me ride his veteran sorting horse, Boone, and I was ready to have at it.

As in sorting clinics, the participants were grouped into groups matching their experience levels from total beginner, to some experience, and to experienced riders. Dave Wolfe steered me into the "some experience" group (probably because he knew that I had ridden for many years and had worked cattle on ranches). Initially, I did not know any of the other clinic participants in my group, but after being partnered with each one on a rotating basis while sorting, we became friends. The almost immediate bond of friendship, teamwork, and encouragement was remarkable. I felt very comfortable learning the basic techniques and rules of ranch sorting.

The instructors for my group were two of Dave Wolfe's sons, Logan and Kason, who were experienced ranch sorters and excellent (and patient) teachers. They explained the techniques of moving the desired cow in the right direction, how to separate the cow to be sorted from the herd or its hooked on companion cow, and how to keep the "bad" cow or cows from entering the other pen. I was surprised how difficult and important it was to be the rider who served as "gate keeper," helping the sorter get the proper numbered cow into the pen while excluding the "bad" cows.

My first attempt was humbling to say the least. Although my cow number 3 was behind two other "bad" cows, our instructors very nicely pointed out my errors and made very constructive suggestions. I'm sure that my horse was very aware that I was a beginner, who needed his experience as a good sorting horse to survive and learn the program. My second, third, and later runs were better and showed steady improvement, but with a long way to go. However, with each run and the longer I watched and waited my next turn, I became more enthused and anxious to compete. In short, I was hooked!

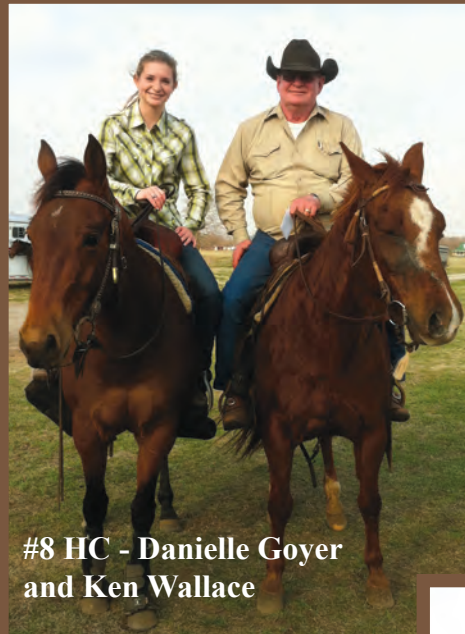
At this event at CSU involved both the clinic that involved 161 individuals who, after the clinic participated as 83 brand new teams in a sorting competition, and on the following day a ranch sorting was held involving over 300 ranch sorting teams. A real vote of thanks goes to the excellent instructors at the clinic who were Dave Wolfe, Logan Wolfe, Kason Wolfe, Mike Hansen, Jim Crossey, Keith Marquart, and Kevin Meyer.

I have been involved with horses in some capacity for over sixty years. I've ridden in rodeos, worked cattle on ranches, ridden for pleasure, done some cutting, and have ridden many miles on trails. I can say without any hesitation that ranch sorting was the most fun that I've ever had on the back of a horse. It was challenging, exciting, and satisfying. In my opinion, an activity that involves a number of strangers who pair up to successfully sort fresh cattle in an event while being cheered on and encouraged by other strangers who are competing in the same event is very special. This is why this old cowboy has gotten hooked on ranch sorting. I'm eagerly looking forward to the next event, and watch out here I come!

We have a saying in Oklahoma, "If you don't like the weather wait a minute". This has certainly been true this year with the March show between snows and the April show almost cancelled due to thunderstorms and tornadoes. Luck was with us as we had sunshine and pleasant temperatures on both days.

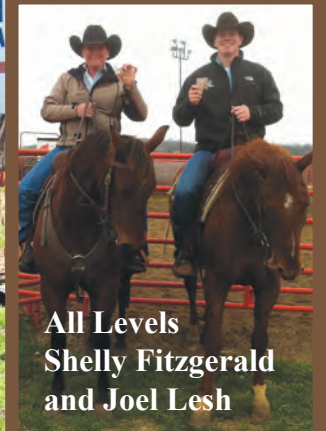

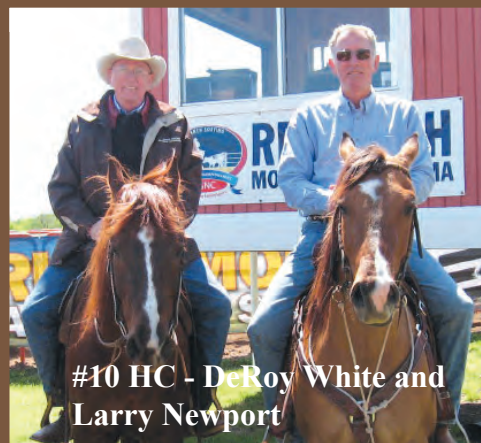

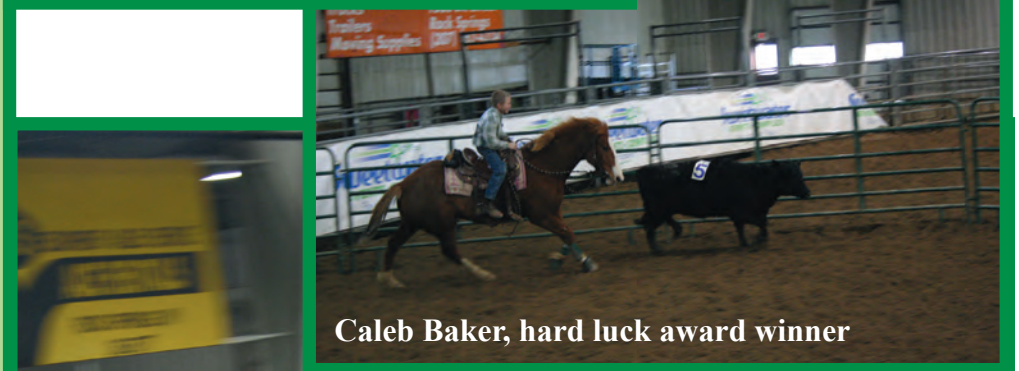
