Hello, Ranch Sorters!

I have the biggest announcement to ever hit the sport of Ranch Sorting! 

I have witnessed the erosion of support for team penning and sorting in my region due to the high cost of participation and inequitable ratings.

Thank you for your positive comments about RSNC. You are just one of numerous contestants looking for more RSNC events east of the Mississippi. I hope your letter will encourage more producers to help fill the gap. "If you produce it, they will come."

Please explain how points are awarded. I apparently misinterpreted the rule, "For the # of points awarded in a division, RSNC has adopted the following AQHA point system for all contestants that receive a time in the Top 10 in any division throughout the year long contest." I thought this meant that any team placing in the top-ten of a class was eligible for points according to the number of class entries.

In this rule, "top-ten" is synonymous with "final-go" or "short-go". In RSNC, the rounds are *progressive*; this means that a team must turn in a time to advance to the next round. A time in the final round is required to earn points as well. This encourages teams to compete appropriately in every round even if they are out of the money; if they sort only one head, they will still earn the points. To reiterate, a team may finish in one of the top ten places by only turning-in a time in the first round of the class – they may even earn a check; however, if they do not get a time in the final round, they do not earn any points.

I have noticed that there isn't a fast-go payback for a class that has less than fifty entries. However, for a class of fifty to one hundred entries, there are two fast-go paybacks. Why isn't there one fast-go payback for a class of fifty or less?

When RSNC was formed, one of the priorities was affordability. With that goal in mind, many of our classes have entry fees of \$25 or less. Most riders like the opportunity to ride more times for less money. Furthermore, if you aren't having great luck in the arena, your checkbook doesn't take such a hard hit at the end of the day. However, low entry fees reduce the size of the pot from which average payouts are taken. Fast-go payouts reduce the overall jackpot even further. So, in order to keep average payouts at a substantial amount, RSNC decided to forego fast-go checks in classes with less than fifty teams. After many math equations, it was decided that "50" was the magic number that allowed a pot to support adequate average winnings as well as fast-go payouts.



2008 NATIONAL FINALS RSNC CLAIMER CLASS

Once again, RSNC will offer two "claimer" classes at the National Finals in Ponca City, Oklahoma. These classes allow RSNC members to market their horses as "for sale" without the hassle of auctions, sales agreements or other sale-related costs. Potential buyers will be able to see the horses in actual competition and compare similarly priced individuals.



above \$5,000 division.

4) Horses can not be re-priced after books have closed on the claimer classes.

5) The seller is responsible for providing any and all documentation as to pedigree, registration, health, etc. of his/her horse(s).

6) RSNC is not responsible for the negotiation or upholding of any agreements made between

not to purchase the horse, then he or she forfeits the \$200 deposit to the seller. The next claimee, according to time, will then have the option to ride the horse. Every potential buyer who tries a horse will have five minutes to decide whether to buy the horse or not. If a buyer makes multiple claims at consecutive times, that buyer must make a decision within five minutes after the last consecutive horse is ridden.

This will be done until all claimed horses have been

Two claimer divisions will be offered. The first division will be for horses priced at \$5000 or below; the second division will be for horses priced above \$5000.

Claimer Class Rules Seller

1) Horses will be priced by the seller; the price will be documented on the entry form.

2) Claimer class entry fee is \$50 with a 60% payback; it is available to members only.

3) All horses priced at \$5,000 or below must be in the \$5,000 and below division; all other horses must be in the

a buyer and seller.

Buyer

1) At any time after a horse has been exhibited in a claimer class, a potential buyer may make a claim on the horse by submitting the proper paperwork and a \$200 deposit.

2) After the class, all claims on horses will be placed in consecutive order according to the time at which the claim was made.

3) Potential buyers will have the opportunity to ride claimed horses; the first claimee, according to time, will have the first opportunity and so forth. If a potential buyer chooses

to purchase a horse, all transactions will be between the buyer and seller. The \$200 deposit will be applied to the total purchase price and will go to the seller. All guarantees of health, soundness, registration, etc. will be between the buyer and the seller. A veterinarian will be on call for any tests agreed upon by the buyer and seller.

4) RSNC is not responsible for the negotiation or upholding of any agreements made between a buyer and seller.

The qualifying season runs through

BIG CLASSES & BIG FUN AT THE BIG DADDY

Old Cheyenne was the setting for the 2008 Big Daddy Summer Spectacular. Eight states were represented by RSNC riders and over 700 teams competed for Cowboy Magic products, cash payouts and buckles. Scattered showers kept the temperatures mild, but the competition was HOT all four days; the fun had by all was at an all-time high. There were a lot of new faces in the winner's circle along with the ones that RSNC has come to recognize and expect. It was a great show!

Results for the Big Daddy RSNC sorting divisions:

The largest class at the Big Daddy Summer Spectacular turned-out to be the **Rookie Ranch Hand** sort. Eighty-eight teams competed for the buckles and the cash! Taking home the top Rookie award was Wyatt Shultz-Gemmill; he earned a Maynard buckle and \$276.76 in cash. Wyatt was assisted by gateman Randy Warner, who also was awarded a

Maynard Buckle along with \$138.51. The winners sorted a total of 19 head of cattle in 166.98 seconds. Coming in just behind the champs were Diane Anderson and her gateman, Dusty Dugan. The second-place finishers turned in a time of 169.60 on 18 head. Third place was taken by Kathy Gilbert and Van Gemmill. Other teams finishing in the top ten of the original eighty-eight were Jennifer Rea and Dave Wolfe; Don Edling and Bette Heller; Cheree Lebrecht and Kason Wolfe; Jennifer Rea and Robert Wright; Scott Wright and Robert Wright; Robert Wright and Jennifer Rea; Cheree Lebrecht and Staci Frazier.

Another big class was the **Beginner Ranch Hand**. Sixty-four teams showed up to compete for the buckles and cash payouts! The big winner of this division was Alan Palu; he took home \$201.28 as well as the trophy buckle. Palu was assisted by gateman Van Gemmill,

who was awarded \$100.64 in addition to his Maynard buckle. The winning team sorted a total of 19 head of cattle in 169.39 seconds. They also had the second-fastest go with a 56.87 on seven head. The Beginner Ranch Hand champion took home a buckle as well as \$201.28; his partner took home \$100.64. Pelu also took second in this class with gateman Bryce Barker; the team sorted 17 cattle in 161.39 seconds. Third place went to Kevin Speer and his partner, Van Gemmill. The third place team sorted a total of 14 head of cattle in 152.66 seconds. Other teams placing in the top ten of the average for the Beginner Ranch Hand division included Andrew Fasth and Dillon Lesmeister; Virgil Taylor and Jim Crossey; Kevin Speer and Logan Wolfe; Amanda Simonson and Logan Wolfe; Kaylin Gemmill and William Daniels, Jr.; Amanda Simonson and Lisa

DeBock; Kevin Speer and Staci Frazier. The fast-go of the Beginner Ranch Hand sort was a 56.26 on seven head of cattle; this time was turned in by Andrew Fasth and Lisa DeBock.

Out of 72 teams in the always tough and competitive **All-Level Handicap**; the first place sum of \$951.06 and Maynard buckles went to the team of Patrick Knoll and Deb Pomerleau. The first place team turned in a total of 28 head of cattle in 151.87 seconds. The second place sort was turned in by Jeannine Gemmill and Mike Gemmill with a time of 172.36 on 27 head. Ron Miller and Van Gemmill came in third with 27 head sorted in 175.7 seconds. Other teams placing in the top ten include the following: Logan Wolfe and Mike Gemmill; Jeannine Gemmill and Danyll Gemmill; Dusty Dugan and Phillip Wright; Clay Kelly and Patrick Knoll; Randy Warner and Richard Smidt; Roger Williams and Dusty Dugan. Fast-go winners in

the All-Levels were Jeannine Gemmill and Danyll Gemmill with a 41.84 on 10 head; second fast-go was a 43.6 on 10 head turned in by Tim Christensen and Phillip Wright.

In the **#14 Ranch Hand**, 58 teams battled it out for the money. Maynard buckles and \$752.92 went to the first place team of Dave Wolfe and Jim Crossey; the winning team turned in a sort of 26 cattle in 168.55 seconds. Dave Wolfe also assisted in the second place sort; he and his son, Logan, turned in a 164.85 on 24 head to be awarded runner-up. Also placing on the third place team was Dave Wolfe; this time, partnering with Richard Smidt and turning-in a sort of 24 head in 168.65 seconds. Other top-placings in the average went to Bette Heller and Van Gemmill as well as the team of Bette Heller and Bryce Barker. The #14 fast-go honors went to Van and Jeannine Gemmill who sorted 10 head in 54.99 seconds; second fast-go went to Richard Smidt and Jim Crossey with a 56.34 on 10 head.

Forty-eight teams competed for the cash and prizes in the **#4 sort**. The winning team of Robert Wright and Cindy Murray walked away with \$634.04. Their winning sort consisted of 11 total head in 108.4 seconds. Runner-up in the #4 was the team of Mayoloe West and Gae Mathis; this team also sorted 11 head. They turned in a total time of 115.01 seconds. Third place in the division was won with a sort of eight head in 96.17 seconds; this was turned in by Greg Curtis and Ken King. Also placing at the top of the average were the teams of Jennifer Jetton and Cheree Lebrecht; Richard Noring and Kathy Gilbert; Kathy Gilbert and Jake Jacobsen; Mayoloe West and Troy Gordon; Kathy Gilbert

and Tim Gilbert; Andrew Lebrecht and Christine McRoy; Jack Gordon and Lucy Mae Gordon.

The **#10 Handicap** class proved tough with 55 teams going after the buckle. That prize, along with \$726.50 in cash, went to Jennifer Rea and Patrick Knoll. The winning team turned in a total of 28 cattle sorted in 166.83 seconds. Next in the running was Deb Pomerleau and Linda Miller; this team was second in the average with a 171.09 on 24 head. Deb and Linda also won the fast-go title with a 55.7 on 10. It was Deb Pomerleau's day as she also had the second fastest go in the #10 HC; she and her partner, Bryce Barker, sorted 10 head of cattle in 57.68 seconds. Winning third in the average with a total time of 172.94 and 24 head sorted was the team of Jim Crossey and Clay Kelly. Also placing in the average were the following teams: Phillip Wright and Dusty Dugan; Randy Warner and Dusty Dugan; Randy Warner and David Goodman; Robin Davis and Ronnie Steadman.

The **Masters #10** consisted of 36 teams; winning the first-place honors was the team of Linda Miller and Deb Pomerleau. The ladies sorted a total of 18 cattle in 112.81 seconds, which earned them a cash payout of \$604.80. Coming in second was the husband and wife partnership of Van and Jeannine Gemmill; they were able to sort a total of 16 head of cattle in 115.31 seconds. In third place was Jeannine Gemmill and Patrick Knoll; this team sorted 15 head in 117.34 seconds. Other top ten average finishers were Tom Jetton and Jeanine Gemmill; Van Gemmill and Jim Lesmeister; Patrick Knoll and Williams Daniels, Jr.; Van Gemmill and Richard Noring; Ron Miller and Laura






Along with tourism and educational camps, the MacGregor

and take-in the sights surrounding this gorgeous homeplace nestled at the foot of the mountains. Both nights were spent around an open campfire as RSNC members, ranch hands, and trustees of the MacGregor Ranch enjoyed cook-outs, conversation, and fun.

Although the MacGregor Ranch isn't open to public trail rides, there are many

other events at the ranch that allow people to have an authentic, history-rich ranch experience. One of the biggest events of the year is the chuckwagon dinner and western gala; it is held annually on the third Saturday of June. Only two hundred fifty tickets are available for this festival; proceeds go to support the ranch's educational endeavors. The day's activities include old-time games such as sack races for the children,

ranch demonstrations such as blacksmithing, ranch tours in the horse-drawn wagon and both silent as well as live auctions. Of course, the meal is from a real chuckwagon. Music and dancing fill the evening. Ticket purchases for next year's event can be made by contacting the ranch offices at (970) 586-3749.

Anyone planning on being in the Estes Park, Colorado, area needs to make a visit to the MacGregor Ranch. More information about the




