Already, after only 60 days from the start of the 2009/2010 season, we are back up to the 3,000 current members that we reached at the end of last season's Finals in June.

The continued open door program for new members is a huge success for the members, producers and RSNC. Make way for 5,000 because here we come!

Ranch Sorters from all over are already starting to gather points for the Sort for the Saddle race and the State Extravaganza. Fortunately this year, we have a full year between Finals and there will be lots of opportunities to earn points. If you don't have points yet you will definitely be putting RSNC events in your headlights when I make the next announcement.

Last year, the top contestant in each of six categories from each state received a special invitation to ride in the State Extravaganza at the National Finals. It was the highlight of the Finals and six saddles were awarded to the Missouri Team. This year we are going to blow the doors off of this contest with the help of our new saddle sponsor Reinsman Equestrian Products. WE ARE DOUBLING PRIZES BY AWARDING 12 SADDLES IN THE STATE EXTRAVAGANZA.

To qualify for the State Extravaganza, you must be in the Top Three from your state in your rating category. To qualify for the Sort for the Saddles, you must be in the Top 20. Either way, your opportunity to win a Dale Martin designed Ranch Sorting saddle will be phenomenal.

We are extremely excited about either opportunity and believe you will be also.

WOW!!! WHAT AN OVERWHELMING APPROVAL, THE YEA'S HAVE IT

The definition of insanity— “doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result.”

Without question, if we were to take a vote among all members within our association about requiring a draw in all divisions, the yea's would out number the nays 5 or 6 to 1.

I realize that one of my biggest faults has always been trying too hard to please everyone and therefore riding the fence and not pleasing anyone. However, the overwhelming response in support from contestants and producers alike has confirmed that our decision to require one mandatory draw is overwhelmingly accurate.

RSNC is exploding and it is because we are contestant friendly! New members have a place to ride whether they have partners or not. New contestants continually tell me that they feel welcome and wanted by RSNC members where ever they go. This sport is about camaraderie and the enjoyment

of sharing your interest of horse activities with others that also enjoy the same activity. With 5 rides available in every division, new contestants look at those who are willing to throw their name in the hat one time as individuals who want to help the new contestant and at the same time grow the great sport of ranch sorting.

It was proven at the National Finals with 3,300 teams that draw teams are just as successful, actually more, as picked teams if everyone participates. Good riders find a way to win and drawing up with new contestants and winning is absolutely the best way to encourage new members. It is happening consistently. Just ask some of some of the multitude of winners at the finals and local show that are winning with contestants they are drawing up with and meeting for the first time.

The draws are also growing participation numbers in all divisions, which increases paybacks for all contestants. I

realize there are a few individuals that are not in favor of the mandatory draw, and I sincerely apologize to them for not better explaining these major benefits that it is bringing to our sport. However, in addition to these benefits, if they would look at the additional money in the jack pot that they are convinced they will win with their 4 picked partners, it far out weighs the single additional entry fee that they are paying for a draw partner. We must be committed to the betterment of the sport and not just the individual wishes of a few.

With the growth we are already experiencing, you had better hold on to your hats because 2010 will be world record breaking. President Obama just might want to consider what RSNC members are doing as a guideline for his stimulus program!

RSNC is doing things a little differently but we are getting the desired results!

PRODUCERS KEEP EVERYONE IN THE KNOW

Not everyone can make it to the RSNC National finals every year. We still want you to have a chance at taking something home with you from RSNC. That is why we have created the **PRODUCER SERIES HIGH POINT AWARDS**.

Most of you already know about the Producer Series High Point awards but our organization has been growing like the magic sea crystals you find in the toy department at Walmart. You just add water and they grow like crazy. Because of this, we want to make sure that all of our new members know that they can still win awesome prizes just by participating at their local events. For each producer that has 5 RSNC Sanctioned shows, they will receive 4 sets of RSNC engraved stirrups. As we keep points from every show for the Saddle Points Race, we also keep points for each producer separately. When the producer turns in their show information we run a separate points race and every time that you ride at that producers show and earn points, we will add up those points. At the end of the 5th show, that producer will know who the High Point Winner from their series in four separate categories are. The Beginner, Rookie, Novice, and Amateur & Above.



These High Points Contestants will receive their set of stirrups from that producer. If you ride at more than one producer's shows, you have a chance at winning more than one set of stirrups. Now what do you think of that? This is a win-win situation. So make sure that you know when there is an event close to your home town so you don't miss out on any. There may be one every weekend just right around the corner. HAPPY SORTING!

WE LOVE KIDS!! AND WE WANT TO MAKE THEM FEEL SPECIAL

Most of us have kids or grandkids and we ALL have been kids at one time or another. SOME OF US STILL ACT LIKE KIDS! That is why we at RSNC want to make them feel special for our 2009-2010 Season.

WE ARE GIVING THEM THEIR OWN NATIONAL POINTS RACE!!!

The points race is going to consist of one class. All youth that are rated #1 that ride in a Youth with experienced gate, and all youth rated #1, #2 or #3 that ride in the Youth Ranked (Youth with Youth) will be eligible for this points race. But it must be

a Youth class. The top five Youth will win a recognition award at the end of the year that will be awarded at the 2010 RSNC National Finals.

Kids, let your producers know that you are interested in them having a youth class at their sanctioned events. This is a class JUST for YOU!

These points will not go towards the RSNC 2009-2010 Finals as ALL YOUTH will be eligible and encouraged to ride at the 2009-2010 National finals.

TO MAKE THE BEST BETTER THAT IS THE NATIONAL 4-H MOTTO AND RSNC LIKES THE WAY THEY THINK!

That is the National 4-H Motto and RSNC likes the way they think!

Last year, we initiated a State Extravaganza competition at the National Finals that became our best division with the most excitement and anticipation surrounding it that we could have ever hoped for. This division was offered to the top contestant in each of six rating categories (Beginner, Rookie, Novice, Amateur, Open & Masters) from each state. Each contestant could enter twice with the other five first place winners to create six teams to represent their home state. Twelve states competed for the first place state honors and six saddles to the winning team! The great state of Missouri beat out 11 other states to win the title of the Best Ranch Sorting State in America and six trophy saddles for their team members. IT WAS THE BEST!

Now we are going to make it BETTER! This year, as the points race heats up, contestants will want to secure their spot in the top three within their rating category from their state. Instead of only the first place contestant, now the top three contestants are eligible to represent their state and compete for the saddles.

But guess what! It won't be for six saddles,

it will be for 12! It will be the biggest saddle give-away in the history of the sport of Ranch Sorting! To qualify, all you have to do is secure a spot in the top three points race from your state. In some states with lots of events that may be a challenge, while in other states it may be a walk in the park. Either way, it will be worth the effort! Up to 18 contestants from each state are eligible: Top Three Beginners, Top Three Rookies, Top Three Novice, Top Three Amateurs, Top Three Open & Top Three Masters. Points will count for only the top individual in each category from each state giving that state a Team point count. The state with the most points will win the title of the "2010 Best Ranch Sorting State in America" and the first six saddles.

The next state with the highest point team will be named the "2010 Reserve Champion State Team" and will also win six saddles!

Your goal is to get in the top Three in your state, to be the best out of those three at the finals in the State Extravaganza Division and be on the best state team.

We're going to double your pleasure and double your fun.

NUGGETS OF COWBOY WISDOM

As human beings we sometimes have a tendency to rationalize things that are wrong to make them seem right. Some people cheat and do other things that they know are wrong. The root cause of many of these behaviors is usually attributed to poor individual ethical standards. To affirm these faults in human behavior one may simply read history, or watch the evening news on any given night.

To help us deal with ethical temptations, there are thousands of books written on ethics and ethical behavior because it is a topic that is very important in this day and time. James P. Owen, author of *Cowboy Ethics*, points out several canons of wisdom that our cowboys of yesteryear followed and lived by throughout their lives. These nuggets of wisdom transfer nicely into our everyday lives today.

First, Live each day with courage – The Earp brothers of Tombstone, Arizona would not have had their famous showdown at the OK Corral which pitted good against evil if it were not for courage, and we would not have the freedom we enjoy today without the courage of our veterans of the armed forces. A quote from John Wayne goes like this:

"Courage is being scared to death but saddling up anyway" John Wayne

Take pride in your work – If the cowboy did not build his fences right and with pride then his life's sustenance (his cattle) would have no safe haven. Obviously, if humankind as a whole did not have a sense of pride in accomplishments we would encounter a plethora of problems. We must also take pride in the work of others as well as ourselves.

Always finish what you start – The cowboy's life consisted of lots of hard work that served a purpose, so the cowboy made dang sure

that he finished his work to serve that purpose. Even though we live busy lives we should adhere to this philosophy and always finish what we start.

Do what has to be done – Our cowboy brethren had to endure some difficult circumstances like driving cattle hundreds of miles without the conveniences of modern transportation, but this job had to be done. In modern times we still have some jobs that are a real drag, but someone has to clean the restroom, roof the house, and mow the yard. It is important that we as responsible and ethical individuals treat the janitor no differently than we treat the king.

Be tough, but fair – Contrary to their tough image, many cowboys used compassion as a base for decisions when they found themselves in an ethical dilemma, but cowboys also believed in good old fashioned Wild West justice. A quote from Larry McMurtry's *"Lonesome Dove"* and Gus McCrae (Robert Duvall) goes like this:

"If you're going to ride with the outlaws then you're going to die with the outlaws".

Gus said this as he handed a former Texas Ranger friend Jake Spoon.

When you make a promise, keep it - Yes, somewhere people still make and keep promises. They choose not to quit when the going gets rough because they promised once to see it through. If you have a ship that you will not desert, if you have people you will not forsake, if you have causes you will not abandon, then you are like the great American cowboy.

Ride for the brand – Cowboys had to be team players or they could not have pushed the herds of cattle up the trails. They understood that their cause affected the greater good of many. In order to preserve the heritage and integrity of our great western

ranching lifestyle, we need to consider the whole and not just the self.

Talk less and say more – Communication is very important, but there are some people (we have all met them) that love to hear themselves talk even when people stop listening to them. Also, some of us may have been to meetings where there was plenty of talking, but little accomplishment. Well, you see cowboys did not do either of these things; because, they had more important things to do like work.

"Never miss a good chance to shut up." Source Unknown

Remember that some things aren't for sale – This is an obvious point, but some people may struggle with this by thinking that anything can be bought. Back in the Wild West days things may have seemed different with the wide open space of western frontier, but some things just aren't for sale.

Lastly, Know when and where to draw the line – The smart cowboys knew when they were in over their heads- and a quote from Oklahoman Will Rogers goes like this:

"An ignorant person is one who doesn't know what you have just found out." Will Rogers

So know when and where to draw the line in life.

Inscription on Mr. John Wayne's headstone:



The 9th Annual Big Daddy Summer Spectacular during the Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo has proven to be one of the largest events of the season for the last 9 years. This year was no exception with 1,036 Ranch Sorting Teams competing for cash and their chance to ride at the rodeo. Contestants from 11 states attended with some from as far away as Wisconsin and Alabama. 

Because of this, Reinsman Equestrian Products and RSN has reached an agreement through sponsorship to promote the saddle to the Ranch Sorters and Producers all across the country.

Currently, most Ranch Sorters are riding some brand of cutting saddle. However, through review of the two disciplines, it is apparent that horsemen of both disciplines are required to ride differently to be successful.

Example: A cutter sits deep in the saddle with his legs straight and forward. When a cutting horse stops and turns, the rider braces against the saddle horn to maintain balance. Additionally, if the cutting horse lunges forward, the cutter pulls on the saddle horn for control since his legs are forward.

When a Ranch Sorter rides, they are upright in the saddle riding with shorter stirrups and their knees are bent with their legs under them. They use their thighs, knees and lower leg to control their balance. Both hands are on the reins and they seldom use the saddle horn for support.

Therefore, the high pommel and saddle horn on a cutting saddle are many times in the way of the Ranch Sorter.

How many of you have buttons missing from your shirts because they were caught on the saddle horn? How many have bruised knuckles or broken fingernails because the saddle horn was in the way?



WINNEMUCCA, NEVADA EVENT

The event was sanctioned with RSNC and many new members were introduced to the exploding ranch sorting association.

Winnemucca has a lot of history with true western heritage as its signature. The town itself was established as a trading post back in 1850. The place was called Frenchman's Ford in those days and served numerous Indians, pioneers and miners who followed the Humboldt River. In 1868, the name was changed by one of President Lincoln's map makers to honor Paiute Indian Chief Winnemucca. The chief's name~ half English and half Paiute, was bestowed on him by white prospectors who

first saw the young Indian wearing only one moccasin with his other foot bare. "Mu-Cha" being the Paiute word for moccasin, the prospectors referred to him as "one a mu-cha" or one moccasin. The name pleased the chief and he adopted it as his own. The daughter of the chief, Sarah Winnemucca became famous in her own right by acting as a peace maker and for speaking up describing her people's plight exiled from their homeland, and the treachery of dishonest Indian agents. In the same year that the city of Winnemucca took its name, the transcontinental railroad reached completion and Winnemucca became a major shipping point for cattle, sheep, gold and silver. Today, Winnemucca is still a gathering place for all of Northern Nevada. Its main appeal these days is entertainment and recreation. Peopled by some of the friendliest folks in the

west and blessed with a mild climate and sparkling clean air, Winnemucca is truly an oasis in the high desert with something to offer for almost every taste.

Without question, this is cowboy country and one of the summer's main attractions is the Labor Day Rodeo which is Nevada's oldest continuous rodeo. The Winnemucca Events Center is as nice a facility for horse and cattle events as you will find anywhere. They have welcomed the sport of Ranch Sorting with open arms and on behalf of Dave Grashuis and RSNC, we would like to thank the contestants and the city of Winnemucca for a fabulous event.
